- While suggestions are given for which song to sing for specific roles, please choose the music that you are most comfortable singing.
 - "I See Stars"- This is recommended for Cady, Janis, Gretchen, Karen & Ensemble Roles
 - **"World Burn"-** This is recommended for Regina. This could be a good choice for Janis as well.
 - "More is Better"- This is recommended for Aaron.
 - "Where Do You Belong"- This is recommended for Damian
- All auditioners will read sides from the script. Sides will be chosen at the director's discretion. Please be prepared to read any roles from the provided sides and monologues.


